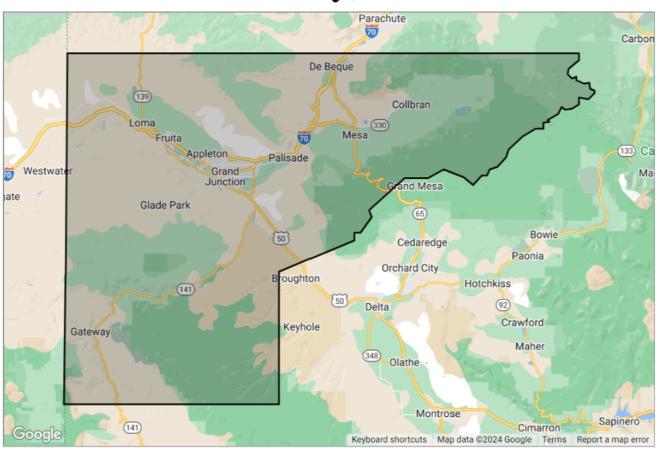

Who We Are

Middleburg neighborhoods transformed from the easy pace of country living to semirural subdivisions in the last decade, as the housing boom spread beyond large metropolitan cities. Residents are traditional, family-oriented consumers. Still more country than rock and roll, they are thrifty but willing to carry some debt and are already investing in their futures. They rely on their smartphones and mobile devices to stay in touch and pride themselves on their expertise. They prefer to buy American and travel in the US. This market is younger but growing in size and assets.

Our Neighborhood

 Semirural locales within metropolitan areas. Neighborhoods changed rapidly in the previous decade with the addition of new single-family homes. Include a number of mobile homes. Affordable housing, median value of \$175,000 with a low vacancy rate. Young couples, many with children; average household size is 2.75.

Socioeconomic Traits

 Education: 65% with a high school diploma or some college. Labor force participation typical of a younger population at 66.7%. Traditional values are the norm here, faith, country, and family. Prefer to buy American and for a good price. Comfortable with the latest in technology, for convenience (online banking or saving money on landlines) and entertainment.

Market Profile

 Residents are partial to domestic vehicles; they like to drive trucks, SUVs, or motorcycles. Entertainment is primarily family-oriented, TV and movie rentals or theme parks and family restaurants. Spending priorities also focus on family (children's toys and apparel) or home DIY projects. Sports include hunting, fishing, bowling, and baseball. TV and magazines provide entertainment and information. Media preferences include country and Christian channels.

Who We Are

Exurbanites residents are now approaching retirement but showing few signs of slowing down. They are active in their communities, generous in their donations, and seasoned travelers. They take advantage of their proximity to large metropolitan centers to support the arts but prefer a more expansive home style in less crowded neighborhoods. They have cultivated a lifestyle that is both affluent and urbane.

Our Neighborhood

 Established neighborhoods (most built between 1970 and 1990) found in the suburban periphery of large metropolitan markets. A larger market of empty nesters, married couples with no children; average household size is 2.50.
 Primarily single-family homes with a high median value of \$423,400, most still carrying mortgages. Higher vacancy rate at 9%.

Socioeconomic Traits

· Residents are college educated; more than half have a bachelor's degree or higher; nearly 81% have some college education. This labor force is beginning to retire. 1 in 3 households currently receive Social Security or retirement income. Labor force participation has declined to less than 60%. More of the residents prefer self-employment or working from home. Consumers are more interested in quality than cost. They take pride in their homes and foster a sense of personal style. Exurbanites residents are well connected, using the Internet for everything from shopping to managing their finances. Sociable and hardworking, they still find time to stay physically fit.

Market Profile

 Exurbanites residents' preferred vehicles are late model luxury cars or SUVs.
 Active supporters of the arts and public television/radio. Attentive to ingredients, they prefer natural or organic products.
 Gardening and home improvement are priorities, but they also use a number of services, from home care and maintenance to personal care.
 Financially active with wide-ranging investments, these investors rely on financial planners, extensive reading, and the Internet to handle their money.

The Green Acres lifestyle features country living and self-reliance. Avid doit-yourselfers, they maintain and remodel their homes, with all the necessary power tools to accomplish the jobs. Gardening, especially growing vegetables, is a priority, again with the right tools, tillers, tractors, and riding mowers. Outdoor living features a variety of sports: hunting and fishing, motorcycling, hiking and camping, and even golf.

Our Neighborhood

 This large segment is concentrated in rural enclaves in metropolitan areas.
 Primarily (not exclusively) older homes with acreage; new housing growth in the past 15 years. Single-family, owneroccupied housing, with a median value of \$235,500. An older market, primarily married couples, most with no children.

Socioeconomic Traits

· Education: More than 60% are college educated. Labor force participation rate is high at 66.8%. Income is derived not only from wages and salaries but also from self-employment (more than 13% of households), investments (27% of households), and increasingly, from retirement. They are cautious consumers with a focus on quality and durability. Comfortable with technology, more as a tool than a trend: banking or paying bills online is convenient; but the Internet is not viewed as entertainment. Economic outlook is professed as pessimistic, but consumers are comfortable with debt, primarily as home and auto loans, and investments.

Market Profile

· Purchasing choices reflect Green Acres residents' country life, including a variety of vehicles, from trucks and SUVs to ATVs and motorcycles, preferably late model. Homeowners favor DIY home improvement projects and gardening. Media of choice are provided by satellite service, radio, and television, also with an emphasis on country and home and garden. Green Acres residents pursue physical fitness vigorously, from working out on home exercise equipment to playing a variety of sports. Residents are active in their communities and a variety of social organizations, from charitable to veterans' clubs.

Who We Are

This market features singles' lifestyles, on a budget. The focus is more on convenience than consumerism, economy over acquisition. Old and Newcomers is composed of neighborhoods in transition, populated by renters who are just beginning their careers or retiring. Some are still in college; some are taking adult education classes. They support charity causes and are environmentally conscious. Age is not always obvious from their choices.

Our Neighborhood

 Metropolitan city dwellers. Predominantly single households, with a mix of married couples (no children); average household size lower at 2.12. 55% renter occupied; average rent is lower than the US. 45% of housing units are singlefamily dwellings; 45% are multiunit buildings in older neighborhoods, built before 1980. Average vacancy rate at 11%.

Socioeconomic Traits

Market Profile

 Residents have a strong sense of community. They volunteer for charities, help fund raise, and recycle. They prefer cell phones to landlines. Entertainment features the Internet (employment searches, rating products, updating social media profiles), watching movies at home, listening to country music, and reading the paper. Vehicles are basically just a means of transportation. Food features convenience, frozen and fast food. They do banking as likely in person as online.

Who We Are

Front Porches are a blend of household types, with more young families with children and more single households than average. More than half of householders are renters, and many of the homes are older town homes or duplexes. Friends and family are central to Front Porches residents and help to influence household buying decisions. Households tend to own just one vehicle, but it is used only when needed.

Our Neighborhood

 Nearly one in five homes is a duplex, triplex, or quad; half are older singlefamily dwellings. Just over half the homes are occupied by renters. Older, established neighborhoods; three quarters of all homes were built before 1980. Single-parent families or singles living alone make up almost half of the households.

Socioeconomic Traits

 Composed of a blue-collar work force with a strong labor force participation rate. Price is more important than brand names or style to these consumers. 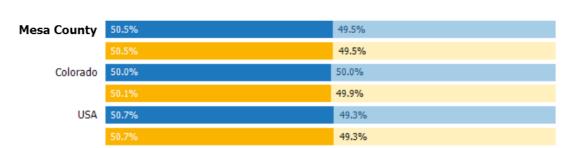

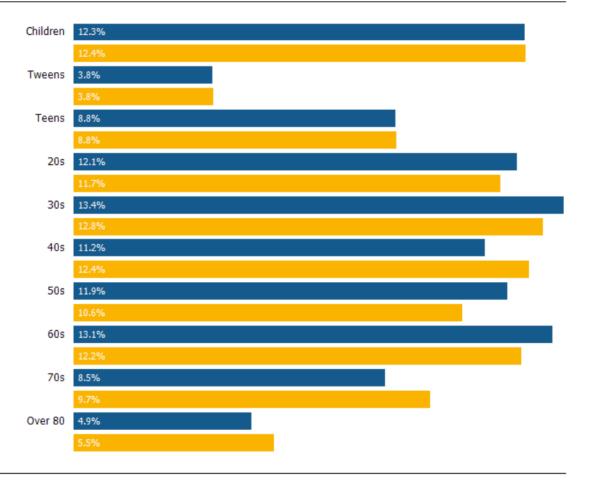
Population by Age

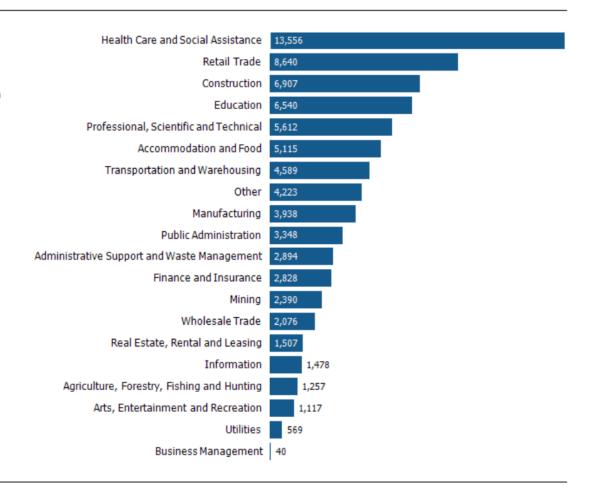


Employment Count by Industry

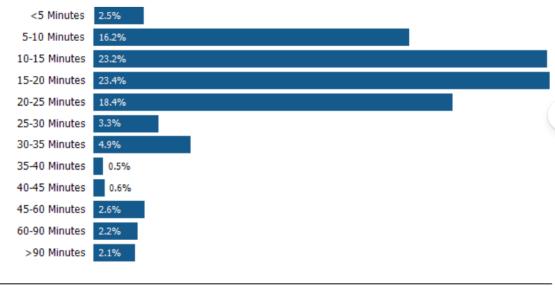

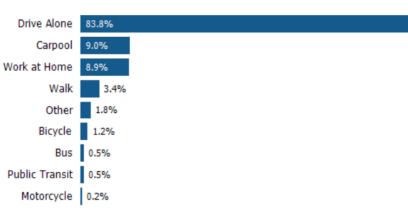
How People Get to Work

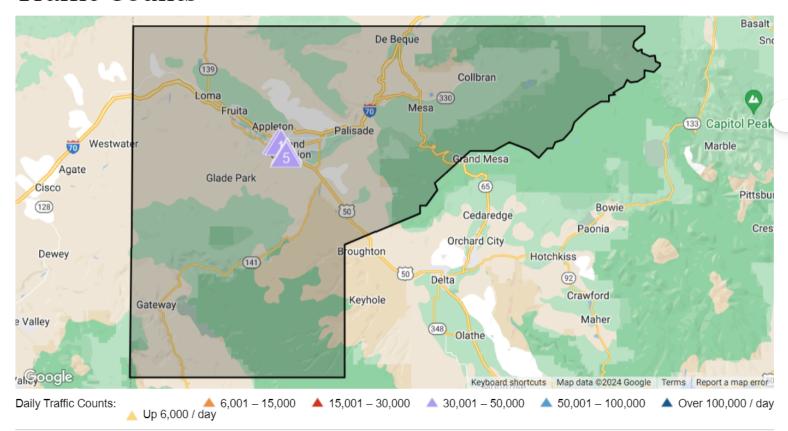
